Grafton Bethel Elementary, Phase II

FY17

Project moved from FY20 to FY17 to coincide with the replacement of the rooftop mounted HVAC equipment.

York Middle 1996 Phase

\$ 150,000 increase

Project moved from FY18 to FY13 and project cost increased due to rapidly deteriorating condition of the roof.

Grafton Complex Roof

FY20-FY21

No \$ Change

Typical life expectancy of this type of roof is 20 years. In FY 21 the roof will be 25 years old and will be 5 years beyond its expected life. Project is being split over FY20 and FY21 because it cannot be completed in one summer.

Coventry Elementary Metal Roof

FY22

\$ 1,200,000

Replacement of the standing metal roof due to roof reaching end of useful life. Roof will be 33 years old at time of replacement.

Magruder Elementary Metal Roof

FY21

\$ 1,200,000

Replacement of the standing metal roof due to roof reaching end of useful life. Roof will be 31 years old at time of replacement.

York Middle, Phase II

FY21

500,000

Replacement of the built up roof due to roof reaching end of useful life. Roof will be over 25 years old at time of replacement.

Replace Gym Bleachers

FY18

Replacement of existing bleachers that have aged and deteriorated. The FY20 bleacher replacement was moved to FY18 due to the condition of the existing equipment. The decrease of \$45,000 is due to recent cost experience in replacing bleachers.

Tabb High

Replacement of existing bleachers that have aged and deteriorated. The FY20 bleacher replacement was moved to FY18 due to the condition of the existing equipment. The decrease of \$45,000 is due to recent cost experience in replacing bleachers.

Various Schools

Hot Water System

FY14 & FY18 \$ No \$ Increase

Project will reengineer and upgrade current system in order to supply hot water to all sinks. Due to the energy crunch in the 1970's and 1980's some of the schools were designed without hot water at sinks in some of the restrooms. With advances in engineering and new technology, it is now possible to provide hot water for the students and staff while still saving energy. Project is being split between FY14 and FY18 rather than all being done in FY20

**Grafton Complex** 

Repair Windows

FY13

250,000 increase \$

Existing windows continue to leak badly when it rains. The windows will be removed, a seal installed around the window opening and the existing windows will be reinstalled. Project moved from FY20 to FY13 due to condition of existing windows. Project cost increased due to recent window replacement cost experience.

Mt. Vernon Elementary

Replace ACT with VCT

FY22

Remove asbestos floor tile in several locations in the original part of the building and replace with vinyl composite tile (VCT).

Dare Elementary & School Board Office

Parking Lot

Expand parking lot to accommodate increased traffic and the need for more parking.

Rubberize Track

FY22

\$ 50,000

Recover rubberized track surface. This is expected from normal wear.

Replace Synthetic Turf

FY22

\$ 250,000

Replace synthetic turf. This is expected from normal wear. The existing synthetic turf will be 15 years old at the time of replacement.

Seaford Elementary

6 Classrooms (K-1)

\$ 250,000 increase

Increased due to EPA regulations for storm water management which was not included in the original cost for the addition.

New Elementary School

\$ 15,951,000

The core of the new elementary school would be built to allow for expansion to a 700 student capacity. The 2015 project plans only provide for a 500 student classroom construction project to reflect projected enrollment needs at that time. Projected cost includes A&E, site work, construction, telecommunications and data, furniture and equipment, and project management. **Bus Parking**

No \$ increase

Project name changed from Bruton Area Bus Parking to Tabb Middle Bus Parking to address issues with the current practice of parking buses at Tabb Middle School. This is a higher priority because of the diminished parking capacity at Tabb Middle School with the parking of buses at this site. Also, the requested funding of \$600,000 for the Bruton Area Parking Lot is insufficient given that land needs to be purchased for that project. Additionally, this project was moved from FY13 to FY14.
