General Information for Summer Academic Programs

Location:	<p>Preschool and Elementary Programs are held at Grafton Bethel Elementary School (BMES, CES, DES, GBES, MVES, SES, TES, and YES students) and Waller Mill Elementary School (MES and WMES students).</p> <p>Middle and High School Programs are held at Waller Mill Elementary School (QLMS students) and Grafton Middle School (GMS, TMS, YMS, and all high school students).</p>
Dates:	Specific Summer Academic program dates are outlined on Academic Program pages found within this catalog and on the YCS D Summer Programs webpage .
Registration:	The Summer Academy Registration is completed through a Microsoft Form link found on the Summer Academy Parent Interest letters sent home to students selected for the Summer Academy. Summer Enrichment Camps registration is completed through SchoolCash Online . This will be available May 11th.

Transportation:	Transportation will be provided at designated stops throughout the county. These may differ from the current school year bus stops. The transportation schedule will be available in early June and can be found on the YCS D Summer Programs webpage .
Attendance:	Students enrolled in Summer Academy are expected to attend class each day. Parents may request permission from the program principal for excused absences.
Special Education:	Students with an identified disability enrolled in Summer Academic Programs will be provided accommodations by YCS D staff.
Tuition:	Preschool, Elementary, and Middle School Summer Academy Programs are offered tuition free. Summer enrollments for middle school Career Investigations and high school credit courses are offered on a tuition basis. Summer Enrichment Camps are offered at no cost to select students who meet eligibility requirements.
Books/Materials:	All instructional materials are provided to students during Summer Academy.
Technology:	Students who enroll in Summer Academy may require access to a computer or laptop with Internet access. Students may continue using their York County School Division issued device during Summer Academy.
Assessments:	End of Course Standards of Learning (SOL) assessments will be administered for all high school credit bearing courses as listed in the program.
Conduct:	Students participating in Summer Programs must abide by the 2025-26 Student Handbook and Conduct of Code. Copies of these documents can be found on the YCS D website.
Food Service:	Breakfast and lunch through the school meal program will be available at all Summer Academy sites. More information will be provided at open house. All students may bring snacks and water.

Extended School Year (ESY)

Extended School Year (ESY) services are individualized special education and/or related services that are uniquely designed to provide a free appropriate public education to a student with disabilities. Any student whose IEP team has determined a need for ESY services will document this in the student's Individual Educational Plan. Students will be working specifically on goals and skills the team agreed would be significantly jeopardized without ESY.

Enrollment is dependent on the IEP team's determination and the data that is presented. If there are questions about a specific student's eligibility, refer to the student's current school.

Elementary Summer Academy

The Elementary Summer Academy is designed for students currently enrolled in grades PK – 5. Students are referred based on their demonstrated proficiency in grade level skills using a combination of report card grades, MAP assessment scores, unit assessments, SOL scores, RPMS data, VALLSS data, and teacher input. Elementary Summer Academy is offered tuition-free.

The Elementary Summer Academy provides students with remediation and support in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics through differentiated whole group and small group instruction. Reading instruction includes a focus on phonics, fluency, and reading comprehension, while math focuses on the process goals of problem solving, connections, communications, representations, and reasoning as outlined in the YCSD K-12 Math Model.

While emphasis is placed on academics, students also participate in numerous fun and engaging activities that focus on physical and emotional well-being. In collaboration with resource teachers, school counselors, and community partnerships, students reconnect with their love of learning while strengthening their academic achievement.

Preschool Summer Academy

Preschool Summer Academy is provided for students currently enrolled in our 4-year-old Virginia Preschool Initiative (VPI) program. Enrollment is based on their demonstrated proficiency in grade level skills using a combination of progress reports, VALLSS data, VKRP data, and teacher input. Preschool Summer Academy is offered tuition-free. Registration

- Students will be recommended by their home schools, and parents/guardians of these students will be notified by their student’s school beginning April 20th. A registration link will be included in the student invitation letter sent home by the home school for parents/guardians to complete.
- Students currently enrolled in the York County School Division (4-Year-old Preschool and K– 5) who do not qualify for the academy based on school recommendation may be placed on the waitlist for the Elementary Summer Academy at their home school through June 12th.

Middle School Summer Academy

The Middle School Summer Academy is designed for students currently enrolled in grades 6 – 8 who have been identified as needing academic support in the areas of reading, writing and mathematics. Students are referred based on their demonstrated proficiency in grade level skills using a combination of report card grades, attendance, MAP assessment results, SOL scores, and teacher input. There is no fee to participate in Summer Academy.

Students enrolled in Middle School Summer Academy will work to develop their math and literacy skills through a cross-curricular approach that creates purposeful learning experiences through real world application.

Career Investigations Course

Description: This course is for rising 7th and 8th grade students to explore career options and begin investigating career opportunities. Students assess their roles in society, identify their roles as workers, analyze their personal assets, complete a basic exploration of career clusters, select career pathways or occupations for further study, and create an Academic and Career Plan based on their academic and career interests and goals after high school. This course also helps students identify and demonstrate the workplace skills employers desire in their future employees.

Students shall acquire content knowledge, workplace skills, community and civic responsibility, and career planning. To meet the requirements of the Profile of a Virginia Graduate, all middle school students must take a career investigations course. To meet the requirements of the Profile of a Virginia Graduate, each middle school must provide a course in career investigations.

Registration: This course will be recommended to students by their school counselor based on a potential schedule conflict for the 2026-2027 school year. No course registrations will be accepted after June 5th. Tuition payment must be completed by June 11th through [SchoolCash Online](#). Please note, there will be no refunds after June 18, 2026. Requests for refunds made on or before June 18, 2026, will be mailed via check issued to the address listed in Aspen. Email Kristin McNally at kmcnally@ycsd.york.va.us to request the refund.

- Location:** Elementary enrichment camps will be held in person at Grafton Bethel Elementary School. Secondary enrichment camps will be held in person at Grafton Middle School.

That communication will include information about registration through SchoolCash Online, along with key dates and next steps. High School Summer Program

The High School Summer Academy is designed to support students who want to earn or recover high school credits during the summer in a flexible, online format.

New this year, YCSD High School Summer Academy (original credit and recovery credit courses) will be offered through Virtual Virginia (VVA). Families are encouraged to explore the [Summer Academy 2026 VHS Course Offerings](#) to gain a general overview of the course available and access course request information.

Student Eligibility

- Rising 9th–12th grade students may:
 - Earn one original high school credit, or
 - Recover up to two credits for courses they previously took but did not pass.
- Rising 9th graders may earn original credit only for Health/PE 9.
- Middle school students who have omitted a high school credit bearing course.
- Current seniors (Class of 2026) may be approved to take additional summer courses if successful completion allows them to graduate on time in July 2026.

Course Enrollment Details

- During High School Summer Academy students may earn one (1) original credit or two (2) recovery credits.
- Current 12th graders attempting to graduate on time in July of their designated cohort graduation year, may take more than one original credit course.
- All course enrollments are reviewed and approved individually.
- Students may enroll only in courses listed on the Summer Academy 2026 VVA Course Offerings document.
- Driver Education is only available in person during Summer Academy. Behind-the-Wheel instruction is not offered through YCSD.
- Courses with insufficient enrollment may not be offered during the High School Summer Academy session.
- Course request forms must be submitted to the school counseling office by **June 5**.
- All fees must be paid by **June 11** to secure enrollment.
- Recovery Credit- Recovery Credit is a truncated online course for students who have completed the traditional seat hours of a course but failed to earn credit for a course. There is a \$200 fee per course.
- Original Credit- Students taking a class for the first time, students who would like to retake a course and attempt a higher final grade or middle school students who have omitted a high school credit-bearing course, can earn original credit for a course. The tuition for an original-credit year-long course is \$375.
- Senior Verification Form- All seniors enrolling in Summer Academy courses to complete Virginia graduation requirements must submit a completed Senior Verification Form signed by both the school counselor and principal.
- Summer Academy graduation is scheduled for July 30, 2026, at 5:30 p.m. in the Grafton High School Auditorium.

Instruction & Testing

- All Summer Academy courses, with the exception of Driver Education, are taught online through synchronous and asynchronous instruction.
- Students enrolled in SOL-based courses will receive detailed information about SOL testing opportunities in late June or early July.

Tuition & Financial Assistance

- Tuition is required for all High School Summer Academy courses, including for seniors.
- Need-based scholarships may be available.

- Families are encouraged to contact their school counselor for help with the scholarship application process.
- Scholarship applications must be submitted by **May 13** for committee review.

If you have questions about eligibility, course options, or financial assistance, contact your child’s school counselor.

Description: This remediation academy is for students who passed the English 11 course but did not earn a passing score on the Spring Writing SOL. The English 11 Writing SOL is one of the verified credits required to satisfy Virginia state graduation requirements. This academy will focus on testing strategies and content support and will be facilitated by a YCSD English teacher. At the conclusion of the Writing Academy, students have the opportunity to retake the Writing SOL and attempt to earn this required verified credit prior to the start of the 2026-2027 school year. **Students will be recommended by their school counselor.**

Students who enroll in High School Summer Academy through VVA require daily, reliable access to a computer or laptop with internet access to be successful in their courses. Students may continue using the York County School Division issued device. Internet access is available at York County public libraries.
