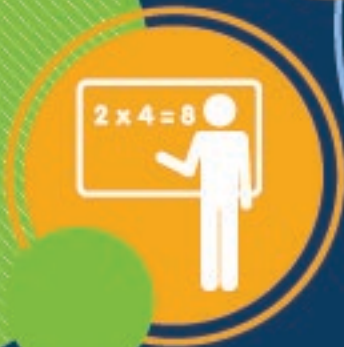

Transportation:	Express bus service will be provided at designated stops throughout the county. These may differ from the current school year bus stops. The schedule will be available in early June 2022.
Attendance:	Students enrolled in Summer Academy are expected to attend classes each day. Students may request permission from the program principal for excused absences.
Student Services:	Students with an identified disability enrolled in Summer Academic Programs will be provided accommodations by YCSD staff.
Tuition:	Preschool, Elementary, and Middle School Summer Academy Programs are offered tuition free. Summer Academy enrollments for high school credit are offered on a tuition basis. Please see the Virtual High School Summer Academy Program page for more information.
Books/Materials:	Textbooks, instructional resources, and library services are available during Summer Academic Programs. All textbooks, library books, and resources must be returned in the condition that they were borrowed.
Technology:	Students who enroll in Summer Academy may require access to a computer or laptop with Internet access. Students may continue using the York County School Division issued device during Summer Academy.
Assessments:	End of Course SOL assessments will be administered for all high school credit bearing courses as listed in the program.
Conduct:	Students participating in Summer Academy Programs must abide by the York County School Division Student Handbook, Student Conduct Code (2021-2022), and Acceptable Use Policy. Copies of these documents can be found on the YCSD website.
Food Service:	Breakfast and lunch through the school meal program will be available free of charge for all students. All students may bring snacks and water to the summer academy program sites.

Parking:

Students wishing to park on campus during Summer Academy must complete a registration form. Students must have a valid driver's license to park at YCSD schools.

Family Engagement

Connect with YCSD this summer to support student success

York County School Division will provide assorted opportunities throughout the month of July to engage families on topics such as: student transitions into 6th and 9th grades, learning more about Canvas (the learning management system), Microsoft Teams, and Aspen (the student information system), supporting student academic and behavioral success, and a variety of other topics to help families support students to be successful in school and be prepared for post-secondary experiences. Family Engagement opportunities will be offered in a variety of formats and times from July 5th through July 27th. More specific information will be provided on the YCSD webpage and through school communications.

Preschool Summer Academy

Preschool Summer Academy is provided for students currently enrolled in our 4-year-old Virginia Preschool Initiative (VPI) program. Enrollment is based on test results (PALS and VKRP), academic performance, and teacher/administrator recommendation. Preschool summer academy is offered tuition free.

Elementary Summer Academy

The Elementary Summer Academy is designed for students currently enrolled in grades K – 5. Enrollment is based on test results (PALS, ORR, MAP), academic performance, and teacher/administrator recommendation. Elementary Summer Academy is offered tuition free. Parents and guardians who wish to enroll their child in this academy must contact their child’s school. Enrollment for students not recommended by their home schools will be based on availability.

The Elementary Summer Academy provides students with remediation in the areas of reading, writing, and mathematics through differentiated whole and small group instruction. Reading instruction includes a focus on phonics, fluency, and reading comprehension while math focuses on the process goals of problem solving, connections, communications, representations, and reasoning as outlined in the YCSD K12 Math Model.

While emphasis is placed on academics, students also participate in numerous fun and engaging activities that focus on physical and emotional well-being. In collaboration with resource teachers, school counselors, and community partnerships, students reconnect with their love of learning while strengthening their academic achievement.

Registration

- Students currently enrolled in the York County School Division (4 Year old Preschool and K- 5) who do not qualify for the academy based on school recommendation may be placed on the waitlist for the Elementary Summer Academy at their home school through June 3rd.

Extended School Year (ESY)

Extended School Year services are individualized special education and/or related services that are uniquely designed to provide a free appropriate public education to a student with disabilities. Any student whose IEP team has determined a need for ESY services will document this in the student's Individual Educational Plan. Students will be working specifically on goals and skills the team agreed would be significantly jeopardized without ESY.

Enrollment is dependent on the IEP Team's determination and the data that is presented. If there are questions about a specific student's eligibility refer to the student's current school.

Middle School Summer Academy

The Middle School Summer Academy is designed for students currently enrolled in grades 6 – 8 who have been identified as needing academic support in the areas of English: reading & writing and mathematics. Students are eligible for the Middle School Summer Academy based on test results (MAPs and Standards of Learning Tests), academic performance, and teacher/administrator recommendation. There is no fee for the academy for students who qualify through school recommendation. Parents and guardians who wish to enroll their child in this academy must contact their student's school counselor. Enrollment for students not recommended by their home schools will be based on availability.

Students enrolled in Middle School Summer Academy will work to develop their math and literacy skills through a cross-curricular, project based learning approach that creates purposeful learning experiences through real world application.

Description: This program will provide support and remediation to students who are struggling to grasp basic letter sound/recognition as well as basic number sense. Teachers will provide engaging activities to help strengthen a student’s foundation in reading and math.

Chess Camp

Grades	3-5

Location	Yorktown Elementary

Description: Come learn the royal game of chess. This class is for both beginners as well as students who already know the basics. Players will learn how all the pieces move, including the rule of en passant and all the rules of castling. In addition, the participants will master basic checkmating skills and opening strategies. The session will end with a tournament and a trophy for the winning player!

English Learner Enrichment Academy – Elementary

Description: This enrichment program is designed for English Learners with a 1 or 2 proficiency level that need extra support with English language acquisition. English Learners will receive engaging English instruction with a focus on English Language Domains (speaking, listening, reading, and writing) through hands on activities and interdisciplinary lessons. At the conclusion of the program families will be provided resources to help prepare for the upcoming school year.

Rising 6th Grade Math Prep

Location	Yorktown Elementary

Description: This program will provide a stronger foundation for rising 6th graders that are scheduled to take Pre-Algebra 6. Transitioning to middle school can be challenging especially when taking advanced courses. Students will review essential skills from 5th grade as well as new skills being introduced in the first quarter. This will build a stronger foundation of skills while preparing students for a successful beginning in Pre-Algebra. To add some extra fun, students will end each day playing the game 24 to build their critical thinking skills with a friendly competition at the end of the program.

Young Authors Camp

Description: This program will provide authentic opportunities for students to fine-tune their writing skills. Teachers will guide students through the writing process focusing on areas of growth for each student while also challenging students to learn new skills like incorporating literary elements, dialogue, and expanded vocabulary. Students will create books to present to families at the end of the program.

Readers Theater

Description: This program will be geared toward students in grades 2-5 with a focus on reading fluency and expression while working toward a final performance for families at the end of the three weeks. Students will be exposed to several reading scripts to improve their fluency, expression, comprehension, and public speaking while increasing self-confidence, motivation, and positivity toward reading. Performing for peers and families will provide authentic experiences as they fine-tune their reading skills.

STEM Enrichment Camp

Description: STEM Enrichment Camp is an engaging program with activities for 4th and 5th grade students who would benefit from science enrichment. Instruction will focus on real world problems that students will solve using the engineering design process. Students will participate in a variety of engaging STEM learning experiences using robotics and coding to explore scientific concepts in more depth. The teacher will facilitate learning as students use their own creativity to explore through engaging hands-on activities.

Middle School Advanced Course Prep

Format	Online

Description: Students will work synchronously online with their teacher to review essential study skills for engaging in rigorous course work. Students will learn note taking skills, resiliency, time management, reading skills, and work to develop skills for analysis and application.

Band Camp

Description: Middle School Summer Band Academy is an exciting summer program designed for students who wish to further their skills in band. The program is designed for students with one to two years' experience in a school band class or by recommendation of their director. The primary focus of the academy is to challenge the middle school students to enhance their performance skills through ensembles playing, mini-lessons, and director coached sectionals.

Description: Students will gather in small groups to read and discuss books. Students will be provided a copy of the books that will be studied and will meet with their teacher for the daily book talk.

STEM Camp

Description: Students will engage in project based, rigorous coursework interweaving the concepts of engineering and design, science, technology, and mathematics. Students will research, plan, develop prototypes, test, and finalize their designs in collaboration with EngagedIN YCSD community partners and staff.

Virtual High School Summer Academy

Virtual High School (VHS) Summer Academy is an online learning program designed for rising 9th grade through current 12th grade students. Parents or guardians who wish to enroll their student(s) in the Virtual High School Academy must contact their student’s school counselor to complete the registration process.

Course Credits & Credit Recovery

A student may earn up to one (1) original credit or two (2) repeat credits (“credit recovery”) each summer. Credit recovery is designed to enable students who have previously failed to earn credit for a high school credit course, to earn a passing final grade for the course by demonstrating mastery of essential content.

Each original full-credit course is 140 online instructional class hours. To meet this state requirement, students are responsible for instruction and information shared during live Microsoft Teams sessions daily Monday - Thursday and must complete approximately 4-5 hours of asynchronous coursework daily Monday- Friday. **Credit cannot be awarded to students who fail to complete the required hours of live and asynchronous instruction.**

Each credit recovery course requires 70 online instructional class hours. **Credit cannot be awarded to students who fail to complete the required hours of online instruction.**

Course Enrollment Guidelines

- A student may earn up to 2 total credits during Virtual High School Summer Academy -one (1) original credit or two (2) repeat credits (“credit recovery”) each summer. *(Seniors may earn additional original credits to meet graduation requirements.)*
- Current 12th graders may take more than one original credit course, if necessary, to meet graduation requirements.
- Behind-the-Wheel instruction is not offered through Virtual High School Summer Academy.
- Courses with insufficient enrollment may not be offered during the Virtual High School Summer Academy session.

Registration

Students currently enrolled in the York County School Division may register for a summer course with Virtual High School Summer Academy by contacting their school counselor through June 15th. **No original credit course registrations will be accepted after June 16th. No recovery course registrations will be accepted after June 23rd.**

Tuition must be paid in full to complete registration. **Students with unpaid tuition at the end of the first week of their Summer Academy Course will be withdrawn.**

Withdrawal and refund requests must be made by the end of the first week of instruction. **No refund of tuition will be made if a student withdraws after the first week of Summer Academy or is dismissed for disciplinary reasons or withdrawn for inactivity.**

Program Dates

The Virtual High School Summer Academy Program will run from June 20th – July 28th. Schools and offices will be closed on July 4th in observation of the July 4th, Independence Day holiday. The Virtual High School Summer Academy Program will run from June 20th – July 27th for original credit courses and June 27th – July 27th, for credit recovery courses.

Virtual High School Summer Academy Graduation is scheduled for July 28th at 3:00 PM in the York High School Auditorium. **York County School Division staff and families will follow current CDC and VDH COVID-19 recommendations and restrictions.** More information will be communicated to all graduating seniors and their families.

Summer Academy Course Orientations

Online course orientations for enrolled students in Virtual High School Academy will be held by their teacher during the first synchronous Microsoft Teams session for their course. **Orientation schedules and links will be available in the announcements of the summer academy course on the student's Canvas dashboard 24 hours prior to the first day of class.** Please note that the first day of class for original credit courses is **June 20th** and **June 27th** for credit recovery courses.

End of Course SOL Testing

Students taking high school credit bearing courses may need to take SOLs to earn verified credits to satisfy Virginia State Graduation requirements. Students and families will be notified of required testing associated with Summer Academy courses they are enrolled in.

High School Credit Courses

Students may choose to complete their coursework remotely or attend a designated on-site lab for support. Students will be required to complete assignments Monday through Friday of each week. High school credit courses require consistent effort, daily participation, and assignment completion. We recommend designating approximately 6 hours per day for Summer Academy coursework. Synchronous Microsoft Teams sessions will be scheduled daily, Monday through Thursday by the online teacher. Students are responsible for the instruction delivered during those sessions. Students should review instructional materials and complete assignments daily. Regular communication with virtual teachers will help ensure academic success.

On-Site Labs

Virtual High School Summer Academy students have the opportunity to complete their virtual coursework in a structured environment between 8:05 AM – 12:20 PM, Monday through Thursday beginning June 27th. Students will be required to complete assignments for Friday of each week remotely. On-site labs will be facilitated at Queens Lake Middle School (for YHS and BHS students) and Yorktown Middle School (for GHS and THS students). On-site labs are monitored by a licensed teacher facilitator. The facilitator will assist students by monitoring their progress and provide instructional and technical assistance as needed. Students may take advantage of transportation provided by the York County School Division.

Technology Requirements

Students who enroll in Virtual High School Summer Academy require consistent access to a computer or laptop with Internet access to be successful in their courses. Students may continue using the York County School Division issued device. Internet access is available at both of the York County public libraries. If you have additional concerns regarding internet access, please contact the Summer Academy Office.

Canvas Learning Management System

VHS courses are conducted using a web-based learning management system called Canvas. Canvas courses are organized in modules, making material easily accessible for students. The main components of a VHS course are:

- Announcements—Communication of important information and updates
- Calendar—Schedule of assignments, activities, and due dates
- Modules—Content is separated into units or modules and is accessible in the course navigation menu.
- Assignments/Assessments—Coursework will be assigned and graded in Canvas.
- Grades- ASPEN is the YCSD gradebook of record. Assignment and assessment grades for virtual courses will be transferred to ASPEN. Students and families should check ASPEN at regular intervals for an accurate report of grades.

Synchronous/Live Sessions

As a component of our YCSD Summer Academy coursework, teachers conduct daily synchronous sessions in Microsoft Teams, Monday- Thursday. Students are responsible for all information shared in these sessions.

Communication

Ongoing communication is essential in an online learning environment. Students and instructors have various tools for online communication, including:

- Discussions—Discussion forums allow for asynchronous communication. Participants discuss course content, ask questions, and reply to prompts. Discussion threads can also be e-mailed to students and instructors.
- Inbox—Canvas Inbox messaging allows for communication between students and teachers.
- Microsoft Teams—These sessions are synchronous online class meetings that can include chat, audio, video, and file sharing abilities.

Attendance

- Credit cannot be awarded to students unless all requirements of the Virtual High School Academy course are fulfilled by July 27th.
